Mr. Moni Kishor Chandra Das was 38 years old when he was diagnosed with leukaemia. It started off with red marks on his body resembling small mosquito bites. Being referred to the National University Hospital as a suspected dengue fever case, he was not prepared for the shock – it turned out to be leukaemia.

"When I received the official diagnosis of leukaemia, I immediately thought I was going to die". Mr. Moni is married with no children. Being the sole breadwinner of the family and earning a meager salary as a ship electrician, he could not afford the hefty bills incurred from cancer treatments.

However, he was introduced to the NCIS Endowment Fund through a medical social worker at NUH. The NCIS Endowment Fund enabled timely treatments of Mr. Moni and paid for his hospital bills. Mr. Moni is currently in remission since December 2011 and is grateful for the financial assistance which he has received.

His message to cancer patients: "Don't worry and stay hopeful".
